

Herbs and Pollinators

In the Summer of 2019, the Youth Conservation Interns planted over 1,200 herbs and ground covers beneath the fruit trees to attract pollinators. This project was funded by the Beazley Foundation grant. By May 2020, 80% of the plant material had survived and the edibles and herbs are still growing strong!
