

Money Point: Almost \$15 million underway!

The best measure of a plan is the degree to which it is already being implemented by eager partners before it is finished.

As the Money Point Revitalization Plan is unveiled today, almost \$15 million in projects is underway to carry out the five goals.

• Living River Restoration Trust: Clean up of river bottom (Mitigation payment from APM Terminals)	\$5,000,000
• US EPA, Region III: \$1 million spent on upland cleanup; action memo signed for additional upland cleanup	1,000,000 5,000,000
• City of Chesapeake: Storm water improvements	340,000
• Elizabeth River Project: Wetland restoration at Elizabeth River Terminal (\$102,000, VA DEQ; \$75,000, NOAA Restoration Center)	177,000
• University of Virginia School of Architecture: Learning Barge design (EPA People, Prosperity and Planet Grant; Virginia Environmental Endowment; anonymous donor)	120,000
• Hess Corp.: Donation for sediment feasibility study	100,000
• Six private industries at Money Point: Conservative estimate of voluntary investments in pollution prevention, clean up of old contamination and restoration of wildlife habitat/buffers.	<u>3,000,000</u>
Total	\$14,737,000
