Best scores yet, plus global resilience model, set the stage to tackle new challenges - with you aboard

Te started at the **bottom.** The Elizabeth River: One of the three most toxic tributaries on the Chesapeake Bay.

That was back in 1991, when the Elizabeth River Project began around a kitchen table.

Imagine our delight with this year's Bay Report Card. The University of Maryland calls out three regions for scores showing "strong improvement:" The Choptank (in the lead; 15-point increase), then, neck-and-neck, the Upper Eastern Shore and the Elizabeth River – each with 13-point gains. In fact, our urban river landed a solid C from the university's Center for Environmental Science. That's despite four centuries of intense industrial and urban development.

Hooray, you! Thank you to our 2,130 members and major donors. You've made the Elizabeth River Project a world model for environmental collaboration. Get ready for 2025:



Our most promising era together yet, thanks to landmark progress you made possible in 2024.

• Our global model for urban coastal resilience, the Ryan Resilience Lab, opened June 1 in Norfolk. The steady stream of visitors has included Paradise Creek Nature Park, NBC's TODAY show, and shows no sign of abating for unique experiences inspiring hope and action, from "Otter Spotters" to the region's first seed bank for native wetlands.

 A record 164 River Star business and government facilities and 6,937 River Star Homes are now doing their part to reduce pollution, restore wetlands, oysters and native plants - including 15 businesses in our new EcoDistrict next to the Ryan Lab.

• More students than ever – more than 2,000 - visited the 40 acres you make possible in Portsmouth, this past school year, thanks in part to our expanded education facilities there. Another 6,600 boarded our Dominion Energy Learning Barge. And – news flash – in 2025 we will introduce the Blocker Program for (Cont'd p. 8)

just got my first tattoo, age 69. Yes, it hurt; and even that adds to the rightness for this moment.

I'm retiring as Executive Director of The Elizabeth River Project around the end of this year. The tattoo, by my friend and the Elizabeth River Project's long-time graphic artist, Deb Colvin, features our enduring symbol, the Brown Pelican. We chose the pelican in 1992, when the Elizabeth River Project was just a handful of volunteers. The first few of these huge birds were returning to the East Coast from the brink of extinction. DDT had been banned and their nests were succeeding again. We thought: If the Brown Pelican can recover, maybe our urban river can too, one day.

Nestled with Deb's pelican, in my tattoo, is also a mummichog, the little fish that had high rates of cancer in too many hotspots of the Elizabeth when I quit my reporter job to help start the Elizabeth River Project. That cancer is down dramatically, thanks to you, supporters and partners. Deb also added a dolphin and an otter (see her design, right). How happy I am that these are now common, joyful sights on the Elizabeth.

But leaving still hurts (just like the tattoo needle). People assume l've set sights on a hammock and books. Maybe soon. For now though, I ache because I don't love our home river any less, nor am l any less enamored of you, marvelous river community.

Milestone year approaches for Money Point cleanup & the Learning Barge

Pioneer projects started together, mature together, thanks to your support.

van full of professors A from the University of Virginia unloaded amid giant petroleum tanks and chain link fences. They had come to Money Point in Chesapeake, lined with facilities shipping world-wide, to advise the Elizabeth River Project on cleaning up one of the most contaminated hotspots on the Chesapeake Bay.

Despite the high security along these shores, Phoebe Crisman, architecture professor, thought there should be a way to bring the public to see the river improve first-hand. She looked up-river. Underway: An icon for the Elizabeth River, one of America's most industrialized waterways – a barge.

Thus was born the Elizabeth with many of their students, **River Project's Dominion** Energy Learning Barge, the world's only barge with a live wetland on board.

Thanks to you, generous supporters and partners, 2025 will mark a milestone year for both Elizabeth River education, aboard campuses including our students a year. Many Learning Barge, now entering its 15th school year welcoming children aboard for hands-on experiments, and the Money Point cleanup – now entering its third and final phase.

"Our wild idea seemed like an impossible experiment, but we made it happen" says

Crisman. She and her partner, Michael Petrus, designed and helped build the barge winning more than a dozen national awards for the selfsustaining systems and ecolearning stations.

The barge has remained consistently popular, typically booking to capacity with more than 6,000 K-12 are from urban schools with limited funds to pay for the field trips. Starting this January, the Blocker Foundation in Suffolk has stepped up to the plate to help fill the gap. Blocker has awarded almost \$300,000, the largest private gift yet for

the Elizabeth River Project's education programs, to launch the Blocker Program for Excellence in Environmental Education

Meanwhile, US Rep.

Bobby Scott along with VA Sen. Angelia Williams Graves and VA Del. Alex Askew have put together \$15 million (\$3 million state and \$12 million federal) for a project getting into full swing in 2025 to address the last nine acres of contamination in the river bottom at Money Point.

Secured at the request of the Elizabeth River Project and building on initial studies funded by YOU, our generous donors, the funds carry out our "Goo must go!" campaign and go to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to clean up polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs) correlated with cancer in fish. The contamination is a legacy of a wood treatment plant defunct since the 1970s.

When the barge welcomed its first students in fall 2009, Robin Dunbar, our Deputy Director Education, knew "from the first day that the barge would change students' lives."

That was when she heard a student coming up the gangway saying, "All I want to do today is touch the river water - I've never touched the river water." (Cont'd p. 8)

Help launch region's first wetland seed library

Not so long ago, we were slogging uphill to convince people to garden with native plants. It's refreshing to now tackle a reverse problem, with your help.

"We have a supply problem for plants native to the Elizabeth. Growers are not meeting the local demand because of this great plant revolution we've had here," says our Luísa Black Ellis, Director of Resilience.

This fall, she helped launch an answer: Seed Keepers of the Elizabeth. The first seed bank for native plants in the region, the program will engage both volunteers and researchers in harvesting, saving and propagating native seeds, especially from wetland plants. The goal: Increase the availability and vigor of plants for river restoration.

Taylor Sloey and Eric Yando, Old Dominion University, and Stephen Via, Norfolk State University, will conduct research in tandem with the project. Diane Wilson, author of the novel *The Seed Keeper*, joins us as keynote for unveiling the seed library this spring.

Special thanks to the Doherty Foundation, providing start-up funding for the Seed Keepers program.

Otters head for winter dens - watch for pups next!

"O tters are probably looking for dens to have pups right now," says Victoria Dunch, our Resilience Research Coordinator. After consulting with Megan Isadore, our expert at the River Otter Ecology Project in California, Victoria reports that otters in our region generally give birth to pups in December or January. They don't build their own dens, though. "They'll be looking for holes in the bases of trees, or their root systems, or holes in banks."

The pups then stay in the dens about 10 weeks, meaning sometime around April, "the mom starts bringing them out to roam about with her."

Keep your camera handy. Thank you to participants in our new Otter Spotter program in cooperation with the project in California. So far, you've reported 71 observations on or around the Elizabeth since we launched this free community science program in March.

Otters are a keystone species. Their comeback here means this urban river's returning health, thanks to YOU, generous members.

Thanks to Dunbar, who managed the barge's construction and design of its equally pioneer curriculum, students do much more on board. pulling up buckets to test the river water, touching live crabs and fish as they learn river ecology, experimenting with the barge's solar and wind power and exploring the Elizabeth's diverse history.

Prior to the barge, Dunbar believed, river children too often were growing up isolated from their home river. "The barge welcomed them, provided an opportunity to engage their senses -and the river did the rest... Magical."

Says Marjorie Mayfield Jackson, Executive Director, of the coming year: "The goo is going and more kids than ever are growing up in love with the Elizabeth.
